Finish the Race!

Wise words from St.Paul

Paul faced many highs and lows in his ministry. Building churches in a foreign land was not easy. But Paul was relentless. He never said it was too hard. He never let anything-not his detractors, not his setbacks, not his finances, and not his circumstances—deter him from his

mission. He stayed faithful to the work that God had called him to do . Or, to use his own words he "competed well; he finished the race" he kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7).

Paul wrote these words to his disciple Timothy to urge him to persist in following the Lord. But we believe that this letter is not just a personal letter to a dear friend; its God's way of telling all of us to stay faithful.

It is also as if Paul were telling all of us "You will make mistakes, you may even lose some battles. But in the end, the prize of eternal glory will come to you and everyone who competes well and finishes the race"

START NOW! Paul was brilliant, but he was also strong-willed, intense and emotionally invested in his missionary work. These are admirable qualities, but it seems that Paul could take them too far at times.

He wanted God to punish those who opposed him (Galatians 5:12)

Paul chose to confront Peter in public when he could have spoken in private.

And he separated from Barnabas over a matter that could have been resolved with more

patience and mutual trust.

Like Paul we all have many great gifts and we all have our own sharp edges.

We might be too abrupt or abrasive but that should not keep us from trying to serve. The demands of work or family can make us fell worn-out but we can still try to find some time to devote to our church. There are plenty of ways we can put our skills to use, even as we ask the Holy Spirit to keep forming us and teaching us how to love as Jesus did.

Jesus told us: "If you remain in my word , you will truly be my disciples and you will know the truth and the truth will set you

I FIND JOY IN EVERY DAY, NOT BECAUSE LIFE IS ALWAYS GOOD, BUT BECAUSE GOD IS. free" (John 8:31-32) How do we remain rooted in the truth?

Here some suggestions:

Be fed by Scripture. In his letter to Timothy, Paul highlights the value of Scripture, because it is "inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2Timothy 3:16)

If we can keep feeding our minds with the word of God , we will become more and more familiar with the truths of God

Be steadfast in prayer. It is in prayer, whether in church or in our own personal prayer, that we can encounter the Lord. Encounters like these can keep us committed to holding onto his truths in our daily lives.

When we give Jesus the first fruits of our time and the first affections of our hearts, we find it easier to hold on to this truth.

I know how challenging this can be. Sometimes I forget to pray or miss Church. When that happens I feel more distant from the Lord and less peaceful. But when I do spend time in prayer, I feel closer to the Lord.

Guard against temptation. To walk in the truth also means being on guard against temptation. Scripture warns us that "the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8). The devil is constantly sending us thoughts and desires that can lead us away from Jesus and we need to be alert to his tactics.

Temptation can be dangerous because it can dull our hearts and minds to the truths of God.

Paul told us to guard the truths of our faith with the help of Holy Spirit.

Stir into flame. Paul advised Timothy to stir into flame the gift of God, that he received. Let's take Paul's advice as well. The Holy Spirit who had filled Paul and empowered Timothy is in our hearts. So let's never underestimate the Spirit's desire to help us love one another or to lift us up when we turn to him. Let's never forget that the Spirit we have received is a spirit of "power, and love and self control" (2 Timothy 1:7).

3. Monthly PAD donation

You may request to sign up for a monthly Pre-Authorized Debit (PAD) donation. This option allows you to automatically make your donation monthly by allowing the church to debit your account for your donation. Please contact the church office if you would like to take advantage of this giving option.

They plant seeds each year with the hope of a bountiful harvest and Trust Jesus to provide. We pray for a safe harvest for all.

RLC will be ramping up its ministerial activities come September. We welcomed visitors from Zion Lutheran during the month of July and worshiped at Zion Lutheran during August.

One Fall Activity that we planned is our Fall Feast, cooked by the men of RLC no less! This will be our second annual Fall Feast with a format very similar to last year's smashing success. The designated date is **Saturday**, **2023 OCT 21**. We **Trust Jesus**, that many will participate. We plan to have a delivery and/or meal pick up option available for those who cannot attend in person. If all goes well, most of the potatoes in our meal will have come from RLC's little garden next door!





As we begin a "new year" in ministry together at Redeemer and in our community, we are excited to be preparing for monthly intergenerational events that will happen immediately following 10:00 Worship on the 1st Sunday of each month. We will begin on October 1st.

You may be wondering "What is intergenerational ministry?"

Throughout the years at Redeemer, we have experienced a wide variety of gatherings, events, worship and more that involved all ages - from many generations. Now we are hoping to create new opportunities for all generations, from children to seniors, to continue connecting and experiencing growing in God's family together.

An organization, known as GenOn Ministries defines intergenerational ministry as nurturing Christ centered community by bringing together two or more generations in planned and purposeful settings, where all are mutually invested.

Many faith communities are discovering the joy of all ages joining together on the spiritual journey. The mingling of innocence and maturity, playfulness and reverence create a bold and bigger vision of the church as the body of Christ. Intergenerational experiences provide opportunities for building relationships with God and the church community, and a chance to open wide the arms of Christ to every person.

Intergenerational Ministry Fosters Spiritual Formation. Throughout scripture, faith is an intergenerational reality. The young and old learn from and care for each other. They challenge one another to release their assumptions, think differently, and to practice compassion. Even today, thousands of years later, we read the scriptures told and retold by our spiritual ancestors. It turns out that Bible reading itself is intergenerational.

No matter one's age, we are all teachers and learners. How much deeper is a faith that is rooted in the experience of those who have lived before and in the experience of one's own life? And how much value is in the life and developing ideals of a culture that has grown up after your own identity and perspective has hardened some? It's as though we plant seeds in each other's hearts and minds that give way to growth, beauty and even more seeds we can then plant in the world.

Over the years, many of our gatherings and activities have tended to be in "same or similar" age groups and we have grown in those settings. For some, there have been other opportunities and reasons to spend time with younger and older folks in our families, communities and life's situations: Grandchildren/grandparents, aging parents, time spent visiting in seniors homes, worship, VBS, volunteer roles ... And now, in the coming months we are anticipating some new intergenerational connections through new opportunities to gather again with all ages and grow together in God's family through learning, playing, creating, praying and eating together.
