A hardened Heart

The 2 sons in Jesus' parable of the prodigal son could not have been more different. The older
son worked tiredslessly in the fields for the good of the family. The younger son took off with
his share of the family inheritance and spent it on "a life of dissipation" (luke 15:13). Yet both
the older and younger son actually had the same problem: they failed to understand the immense blessings that came with being a son of their father and living in their father's house.

At various times in your life, you might have identified with either son- that's the genius of
Jesus's parable! In this article, we will take a deeper look at the actions of the older son to see
the ways in which we might need to let go of certain attitudes and misconceptions that isolate
us from God and from one another.

A "Slave of the Father"

We know enough about the older son to understand that he would have never left his father's
house with his inheritance in hand. No, he was a dutiful son. He is the person we all want to
be; the one who is loyal, faithful and can be counted on to complete the job assigned to them.
The older son in the parable acted as if he were a slave of his father. " Look" he says to his father, " all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders" (Luke 15:29). Perhaps he didn't think that his father would be merciful if he did fail in some way. And so resentment and bitterness began to build in his heart.

How easily we can fall into the same mindset! We might be tempted to relate to God as an employee would to his boss rather than as a child to his father. We might be unaware of our inherent dignity as a son or daughter of God or how much the Lord loves and cares for us, even when we fail.

For reflection: How has my working so hard to please the Lord obscured my experience of the blessing of living as a son or daughter in the Father's house?


