The unaudited financial statements and trends for 2023 show that we had a surplus of \$29,071.32 before the fund account revenues and expenses. The surplus for December was \$19,678.25. The envelope giving for 2023 was \$282,339.75, about \$7,700 less than budgeted. Thank you to everyone who had so generously contributed to Redeemer's operations throughout 2023. Audited financial statements for 2023 will be presented at the next annual gen-

eral congregational meeting.

The unaudited financial statements also show the amount of agency contributions that members had contributed to throughout the year. A total of \$12,394.25 was donated by members to agencies such as CLWR, Luminhos, the Salvation Army, Camp Kinasao, the Saskatoon Food Bank and others.

An offering plate is located at the top of the stairs in the sanctuary for you to drop off your donation as you enter or exit the church service. In addition, the following options are available for you to make a donation:

1. Mail to or drop off a cheque at the church

You can mail a cheque directly to the church office. Mailing address: 812 Preston Avenue, Saskatoon, Sask. S7H 2V2. You can also drop off a cheque in the mailbox at the front of the church or in the church office.

2. Interac E-Transfer using online banking

We are set up for automatic deposit. If you use online banking, you may make a payment to Redeemer Lutheran Church by:

- i. Logging into your personal banking account, add Redeemer Lutheran Church as a recipient using the email address <u>redeemer.luth.stoon@sasktel.net</u>

#### 3. Monthly PAD donation

You may request to sign up for a monthly Pre-Authorized Debit (PAD) donation. This option allows you to automatically make your donation monthly by allowing the church to debit your account for your donation. Please contact the church office if you would like to take advantage of this giving option.

Please note that you may also donate marketable securities to the church. This will allow you to eliminate any capital gains taxes and allow you a tax donation credit at the same time.

How hard it is to even say: My condolences. "I don't know what to say". Discussing death and dying is not your typical coffee shop conversation. My Husband and I had always been very open when it came to talking about the end of life. After he got his cancer diagnosis we sat together. We cried, we laughed. And we imagined what it would be like.... To die and being dead.

By facilitating the Death Café, my goal is to ease the hesitation and discomfort of talking about death and dying.
