This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent (John 6:29)

Jesus performed an amazing miracle feeding 5000 people with a few loaves and fishes. When the crowd goes looking for him, he knows it is because they want more to eat. So he tells the, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life (6:27)

But again the crowd misunderstands. They think Jesus is telling them to do something more or try harder. So he clarifies: at its heart this "work of God" is all about believing in him, the One whom the Father has sent (John 6:29)

We might wonder-as perhaps the people in the crowd did that day—what the work of believing involves. Isnt' believing just a matter of our minds? But Jesus seems to indicate that belief is something that requires us to be active not passive.

Let's see what that might be:

- ⇒ Believing in Jesus means that just as we would with any loved one, we seek to nurture our relationship with him. This is why listening him in prayer and reflecting on the Scriptures are so essential. It's why we need to do the "work" of setting aside time each day for him
- ⇒ The "work of believing requires that we trust in the Lord, even when we are suffering or when we are going through a trial. In those times we may be tempted to doubt God's love or care for us. That's when we need to actively lean into our relationship with Jesus making a point of turning to him as often as we can. It is also when we have to set aside our doubts and proclaim our trust in the Lord.
- ⇒ Along with trust the "work" of believing involves surrendering our lives to Jesus and placing ourselves in his capable hands. It involves actively believing that Jesus can handle any problem we encounter and that he knows better than we do what is best for us.

Lord, help me to believe in you more deeply today!



What Is Stephen Ministry?

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Stephen Ministry offers a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members—called *Stephen Ministers*—





Who's Involved in Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Leaders are church staff, lay leaders, and pastors trained to provide ongoing leadership for their congregation's Stephen Ministry. They are equipped for this key role through the Stephen Leader



Training Course offered by Stephen Ministries St. Louis.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members trained by their Stephen Leaders to offer care to people who are hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week for about an hour.

Care receivers are individuals in the congregation or community who are going through a crisis or life difficulty. Potential care receivers first meet with a pastor or Stephen Leader, who assesses their needs



or care and matches them with a Stephen Minister. The caring relationship lasts for as long as the need persists.

The Blessings of Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry multiplies blessings throughout the church and community.

- Congregations carry out Christ's commandment to "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12 RSV) in a powerful and practical way.
- Pastors have a team of gifted, trained, and committed lay caregivers ready to minister to hurting people.
- Laypeople nurture and use their gifts in meaningful ministry, growing spiritually as they serve others.
- People who are hurting have a caring Christian presence to provide emotional and spiritual support.

In short, Stephen Ministry helps carry out the mission of the church.


3. Monthly PAD donation
