My dear friend Sally wanted to give a birthday party for one of her friends. She knew her friend had been experiencing a tough time, and Sally desired to help lift her spirits. However, Sally was unemployed and didn't have extra money to purchase food for a nice party. So she looked in her refrigerator and cabinets to see what was available. She then created a nice spread consisting of many items she'd previously purchased and had in her home.

When Sally shared with me the creative menu she had come up with, I thought about the story of Elijah and the widow (1 Kings 17:7-16). The widow didn't have much. In fact, she told the prophet Elijah that she was going to prepare her final scraps of food for herself and her son "and [then] die" of starvation (v. 12). And she only had a small amount of flour and olive oil, just enough for their final meal.

But Elijah ensured the woman that her "jar of flour . . . and the jug of oil [would] not run dry" until God sent rain again (v. 14). By trusting in what God revealed through Elijah—even though she didn't think she had enough—the woman found that God provided what she needed even though her kitchen

was barren.

Just like my friend, the widow found what she needed. Following their examples, let's live generously and rest in God's provision for us.



Sidewalk Upgrading and More – In The Works

Earlier this summer a dedicated team of painters refinished the trim outside the Fellowship Hall and around the whole church.

You may have noticed that the Property Management People have undertaken some edging of the sidewalks leading into the Fellowship Hall. We have an opportunity to enhance the safety and security of the sidewalk system in the next few weeks. Having the Fall Feast on Saturday 2025 OCT 18 would be a great way to christen the finished work and welcome all our guests that day.

There is about 500 square feet of sidewalk in the Fellowship Hall Area that needs some Tender Loving Care. Shercom Industries – A Saskatchewan owned and based company will complete the sidewalk upgrade within the next week or two (weather permitting).

With your help and a special, one-time donation, Redeemer and Friends can make that happen. The cost of **all the upgrades** is estimated to be \$15,000; very doable by Redeemer. With the goal of raising the \$15,000.00 expected expenses to cover all the work in progress and planned upgrades, here are some options:

One square foot of all repairs: \$15000.00/500 = \$30 per square foot.

One square yard of all the repairs: $$30.00 \times 9 = 270.00 .
