The month of November 2025 has snuck upon us! Nature is

The sidewalk project in front of the hall has been completed and with the wonderful contributions of labour and financial gifts, RLC members have again proven that they are second to none. Thank you all so much. On a less positive note, the discussions regarding amalgamation with Zion Lutheran Church, have grounded to a sudden halt, so we have more discussions and planning on the horizon.

November is a month set aside for giving thanks. Pausing and giving thanks is something we cannot do enough. Every leaf that drops is a chance for something new. November's charm lies in it's pause for reflection, it reminds us that change can be beautiful. Traditionally, November is the month for stewardship. As a noun, a steward is a person who cares for and looks after something. As a verb, it is the activity of looking after, managing or supervising something.

In the Bible there are many references to "steward" as a noun. People living in those times were familiar with the role of a steward. The Bible contains less reference to it as a verb. **One** such instance is **1 Peter 4:10. It says**, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in it's various forms" (NIV). We learn from this, that we are all stewards of God.

Being a steward has a purpose. We manage and care for certain commodities to be able to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ. Serving others means putting other people's needs alongside, even before our own and that my friends, can be very hard!

Being a steward isn't something "out there". Being a steward is tending to, taking care of, what's right in our midst. We don't have to go look for something to steward, there are plenty of opportunities to steward right under our noses, right in our neighborhood and right in our homes.

We steward God's grace. Like manna fed God's people as they wandered in the wilderness and desert, so too God takes care of us. That grace extended to us is intended to propel us to steward what we have, sharing as we see a need and to look for ways to multiply what we have, to share with those that do not have. Share a meal, per chance open your home, or open your heart and offer a listening ear.

May God bless RLC, our pastors, all our stewards/congregants and keep us all safe during the rest of 2025 ahead.





There was a surplus of \$8,333.26 for the month of September 2025 and a surplus of \$10,027.68 for the year to the end of September 2025, before the fund accounts revenues and expenses. The general fund giving for September 2025 was \$25,482.14 and for the year to the end of September 2025 it was \$200,639.60. The sidewalk project revenues (included as "Capital Income) to the end of September 2025 were \$6,665.00. Thank you to everyone who

has so generously contributed to Redeemer's operations.
