Mercy and our mess

During Sunday school, my patience with three-year-old Peter was wearing thin. He was unhappy, unkind to the other kids, and absolutely refused to be content, even when we offered him the most coveted toys. My pity turned to annoyance. If he stubbornly persisted in being difficult, then fine, I'd send him back to his parents and he would miss out on all the fun.

Too often I find my compassion has conditions. If someone ignores my advice or refuses my help, then they don't deserve it anymore. Fortunately, God doesn't act that way toward us. The prophet Jonah experienced His great mercy after a time of stubborn disobedience when God commanded him to travel and preach to Nineveh (Jonah 1:2). Defiantly choosing the opposite direction, Jonah was caught in a terrible storm, set adrift at sea, and then swallowed by a great fish—a self-made disaster (vv. 4, 15-17). When Jonah finally “prayed to the Lord his God” (2:1), God was still listening to him, ready to forgive His reluctant prophet. Jonah was delivered from the fish and graciously given a second chance to go to Nineveh (3:1).

In little Peter's case, a trip to the playground consoled him—a brilliant idea by a helper with more patience than I had shown. How beautiful is mercy that continually seeks us out, even in the middle of our own mess.

If you want to buy fruit, muffins &/or juice boxes, you can leave them in the clear bin at the front of the church.

FINANCIAL UPDATE



"There was a surplus of \$8,747.08 for the month of December 2025 and a surplus of \$25,685.47 for the year to the end of December 2025, before the fund accounts revenues and expenses. The general fund/envelope giving for December 2025 was \$38,682.60 and for the year to the end of December 2025 it was \$281,772.20. The general fund giving for 2025 was approximately \$6,800.00 more than what was budgeted for the year. Thank you to everyone who has so generously contributed to Redeemer's operations.

The final reviewed financial statements for 2025 and the 2026 budget should be available by the beginning of March 2026 and will be available for your review before the 2026 annual general meeting.

An offering plate is located at the top of the stairs in the sanctuary for you to drop off your donation as you enter or exit the church service. In addition, the following options are available for you to make a donation to Redeemer Lutheran Church:

1. Mail or drop off a cheque at the church

2. Interac E-transfer using online banking

3. Monthly PAD donation

You may request to sign up for a monthly Pre-Authorized Debit (PAD) donation. This option allows you to automatically make your donation monthly by allowing the church to debit your account for your donation. The benefits of Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry is a church-based, lay caregiving program that equips trained volunteers (Stephen Ministers) to provide one-to-one Christian care to people going through difficult seasons. Its benefits are wide-ranging—for individuals, churches, and the wider community.

Benefits for Care Receivers

- **Consistent, confidential support** during crises such as grief, illness, divorce, job loss, or loneliness
 - **Christ-centered care** that integrates faith, prayer, and Scripture with emotional support
 - **Long-term companionship**, not just short-term help
- Reduced isolation**, knowing someone walks alongside them regularly

Benefits for Stephen Ministers (Caregivers)

- **High-quality training** in listening, empathy, boundaries, and spiritual care
 - **Personal spiritual growth** and deeper faith maturity
 - **Meaningful service**, using gifts to care for others in tangible ways
- Ongoing supervision and support**, preventing burnout

Benefits for Pastors and Church Leaders

- **Shared care responsibilities**, allowing pastors to focus on preaching, teaching, and leadership
 - **Stronger pastoral care system** without overextending clergy
- Confidence that members are well cared for**, even in complex or long-term situations

Benefits for the Congregation

- **A culture of care**, compassion, and mutual support
 - **Stronger relationships and trust** within the church community
 - **Practical expression of Christian love**, not just words
- Effective outreach**, as care often extends beyond church members

Benefits for the Community

- **Accessible emotional and spiritual care** at no cost
 - **A visible witness of Christ's love** through compassionate presence
- Support during life's hardest moments**, when people are most vulnerable

In short, Stephen Ministry strengthens the church's ability to live out Galatians 6:2: *"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."*
